

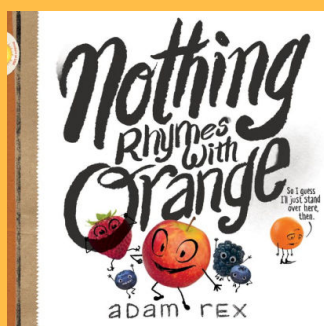

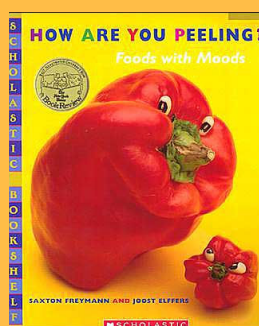

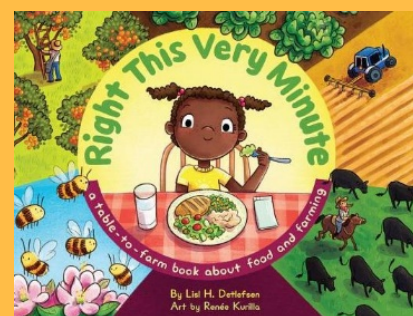
Consider exploring citrus themed books\*:

Explore the parts of a citrus plant.

Focus on discussion questions such as:

- How long from when it is planted to when the citrus fruit is harvested?
- How do you think the fruit is harvested?
- What type of needs does a citrus plant have (air, water, soil, light, etc.)?
